A first-generation Haitian American, Dr. Lubin grew up in Miami's rich cultural milieu of immigrants from the Caribbean and Central and South America. This experience profoundly shaped her sense of justice, equity and appreciation for the beauty and humanity of all people.

Whether or not the officer

involved is charged, Lubin said, "We can't give up hope. We can't accept that as status quo or unchangeable. We have models on how to bring down a legal system" such as the Civil Rights Movement, which she sees as "an ideal model" for pushing for change. "Even in our grief, we still have to have clarity. We can change things. "We have to be strategic about it, and look at this through policy," continued Lubin.











